I. of M. Rah!—Hah! Hoo Hah! Hoo Hah! Michigan Rah! Rah! Sassa-boom-ah! Whickee, Michigan! A holiday event which is anticipated by the older and the younger sets alike will be the concert and dancing party January 1 given by the Michigan alumni in honor of the Glee club of the University of Michigan. The concert will be given at the Lyric theater and will be followed by the dancing party at the Rome hotel at about 10 o'clock. The invitations for the dancing party will be issued this week.

The Michigan men arrive Saturday morning from Minneapolis in a private car and they will remain over in Omaha until Monday morning, and there will be much done for them in a social way. They will be the guests of Mr. John R. Webster at luncheon at the Omaha club on their arrival, where they will meet representative citizens of Omaha. A reception will follow at Mr. Webster's home in the afternoon from 3 to 5 o'clock, when about fifty young women will be invited to meet the men. Mr. Webster will entertain the club at dinner preceding the concert Saturday evening. The club is taking a trip that will include 4,200 miles in all and is always handsomely received wherever it goes. In the party is a young Japanese prince who plays the mandolin. Prince Kanaya Fujita, according to eastern critics, has considerable ability. He is the assistant to Dean Cooley of the engineering department at the University of Michigan and is an addition to the Musical club, as he is an expert mandolin player, and has invented a mandolin music which is an improvement on the tone of the instrument.

The Michigan women, "matte and blue," will be used in the ball room and at the concert in the evening at the Lyric theater stage will be decorated with Michigan pennants, and it is understood that different colleges will decorate boxes with their own colors. Yale has taken two boxes, Cornell two and Harvard two. The two Omaha men who have been members of these clubs and toured with them are former trips are Stanley Rosewater and Jack Webster. The boys will make the Omaha club their headquarters during their stay in Omaha.

The University of Michigan Alumni association of the Missouri valley includes some of the most prominent men of Omaha. Mr. Charles E. Noyes is president. Mr. John R. Webster first vice president, Dr. Donald McRae of Council Bluffs second vice president, Mr. R. B. Windham of Plattsmouth third vice president, Mr. Stanley Rosewater secretary and Mr. Edward J. Waters treasurer. Judge D. M. Vinsonhall will serve as chairman of the reception committee at the ball. Mr. A. C. Ellick is chairman of decorations, Mr. J. R. Webster chairman of general entertainment and Mr. G. M. Hiltchcock chairman of the executive committee.

Indications are that New Year's day will be celebrated in Omaha with all the traditional good cheer and hospitality. Invitations have been issued for at least two large receptions and the first of the week will bring cards for at least one more. Mr. and Mrs. John Robert Webster and Mrs. Charles Offutt have issued invitations for a reception to be given at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Webster, 213 Farnam street, for New Year's afternoon from 3 to 5 o'clock to meet the members of the Glee club of the University of Michigan.

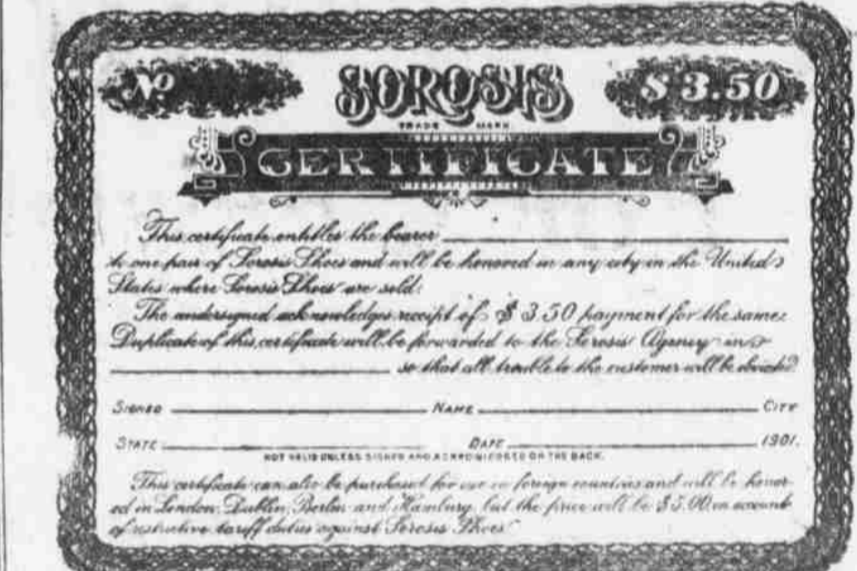
