An auditing staff must be appointed to do the work and the appointment of this staff will be with the county clerk. The Board of County Commissioners will have the right to fix salaries for these new employees.

The opinion of the county attorney's office will gravely disappoint several would-be pleaders to consider the appointment of Commissioners Bedford, Pickard and Bruning to be put into the shoes of Emmet G. Solomon.
