Noyes to Prove Sanity and Charge

Man Who Tells of Wife's Escape and His Shooting Fails to Convince English.

Deputy sheriffs have taken into custody Charles Noyes of Waterloo. Noyes must appear before the Board of Insanity Commissioners on a charge of insanity. Mrs. Noyes is the plaintiff.

Mr. Noyes tried to have informations lodged against his wife and Miles Neil, also of Waterloo, but County Attorney English declined to proceed unless Noyes can furnish more evidence than his own story.

"You tell an interesting narrative about the emptying of the revolver," said English to Noyes, "but you must prove it, if a case is to be started."

Mrs. Noyes denies the tale which her husband tells about herself and Neil meeting in Douglas county for years and years. The formula is this: When convicted in police court file an appeal bond—this is easy because it does not require cash—then leave town or move, or wait till the city's witnesses disappear so that the city prosecutor must nolle the case when it reaches district court. It will not be difficult to get some one to go on a bond in police court, for there never has been a suit to collect an appeal bond from police court, although all are duly ordered forfeited.

The county attorney's office thinks it is up to the attorney for the Omaha Board of Education, because the school board gets the money—or might, if the suits were prosecuted. SEVENTY APPEALS DISMISSED

BIG YEAR FOR COLONISTS

Rich Harvest of Land Settlement is Looked For by Railroads.

EXPECT TO BEAT BANNER, 1909

Harriman and Hill Lines Are Making Preparations to Handle Enormous Traffic to the Homestead Country.

Colonizing work done by the railroads in the west and the Pacific northwest during the fall of 1909 broke all records in railway history and local railroad officials look to even a greater invasion of the western country during the spring of 1910.

Figures prepared in the offices of the Harriman lines and the Burlington route indicate an increase in the movement of homesteaders of fully 70 per cent over the figures for 1909. The Harriman lines carried more homesteaders to the northwest in 1909 than in any year of its history.

D. Clem Deaver, superintendent of the homesteaders' department of the Burlington route, predicts a great influx of land seekers and homesteaders to the northwest during the spring and fall of 1910.

The Western Passenger association is now collecting over the dates for excursions to the west and the cost of transportation. The Transcontinental Passenger association will hold a session in Chicago January 25 when dates will be fixed and rates announced for homesteaders and tourists.

Representative Charles A. Randall of Newman Grove is one of the latest to ac-

quire large tracts of land in Wyoming. He has just completed a deal whereby he has obtained title to 800 acres of land between Basin and Greybull, Wyo. A portion of this property he will set aside to be known as Basin Gardens, a sort of public park.

In each year the railroads have two short periods which they call colonist periods. The spring colonist period is from March 1 to April 30, and the fall period from September 15 to October 15. In the fall period of 1909 the Harriman lines sold a total of 15,411 tickets to California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Utah, Colorado and Wyoming points. In the corresponding period of 1908 the same lines sold only a total of 6,377. This is an increase in the fall period of 85 per cent.
