





the corn contained but 27 per cent molature after the soaking. As much of the corn being received on

the Omaha market contains from 18 to 24 per cent moisture it is evident that with that amount, even freezing for a short time, kills the possibility of the corn growing. Excessive molecure without freezing weakens the vitality of the corn has been

shown by a test made by the Commercial club. Two hundred grains of corn which contained 21 per cent moisture were secured on the Grain exchange Monday and there were seventy-four grains which had no root sprouts, but which had stem sprouts corn which would perhaps produce a stalk, but no ears and which experts say should

never be planted. The Omaha Elevator company, with a line of elevators on the Union Pacific, has arranged to have tests made by the club from many of its seventy stations, while one sample was received today from Keith sounty.
