Hebrew Months.

Hebrew scholars orientate to straighten me out? In Watson's ecclesiantical dictionary, under the title: "Months." omitting the Hebrew, he states: "Sometimes called new moons, from the circumstance of their commencing with the new moon, anciently had no separate names, with the exception of the first, which was called Abio, that is, 'the month of the young ears of corn,' Exod. xiii: 4; xxiii: 15; xxiv: 18; Deut. xvi: 1. During the captivity. the Hebrews adopted the Babylonian names for their months, which were as follows and they were reckoned thus: (1) Nisan, from the new moon of April. (2) Zif or Ziv, also called (Artemissius, far and Iyar) (3) Sivan. (4) Tammiz. (5) Ab. (6) Elul. Tishri. (8) Bul, (9) Kislev. (10) Tebeth. (11) Shubat. (12) Adar, also the intercalary month Ve-Adar." Tebeth, Shebat and Adar, form the new moon of January, February form the new moon of January, February and March, respectively.
