Former United States Senator John M. Thurston was in Omaha Thursday as the guest of Richard S. Hall. He is en route west on a business trip which will take him as far as Phoenix, Ariz.

"I should like very much to have more time to spend in Omaha," said Senator Thurston. "Coming back I may be able to do so, but of that I cannot be certain. I shall be in Nebraska next fall, however, to take a part in the campaign."

On the matter of insurgency in the west, the senator said he knew too little to be able to speak at length of it.
