

JUDAHY CHAUFFEUR SURGEON

Man Who Operated on Lillis Said to Be Young Doctor.

HIRED MONTHS FOR JOB, RUMOR

Said to Have Received an Enormous Fee for His Work, Which Was Not Done with Any Rusty Knife.

Out of the maze of reports and rumors of the character and kind of injuries Jack Judahy inflicted on Jere Lillis on that fateful night at the Cudahy home in Kansas City, comes one by way of Chicago which, while not entirely unique in its tenor, adds light to a point partially obscured in the minds of some who have hesitated to speculate upon the matter.

John Moss, the missing chauffeur, involved in the Cudahy case as the alleged assistant of Jack Cudahy on the evening of the attack on Jere Lillis, may not be a chauffeur at all, but a young surgeon, having the role of auto driver in order that whatever attack with a knife was made would be by skilled hands, says the Chicago News.
