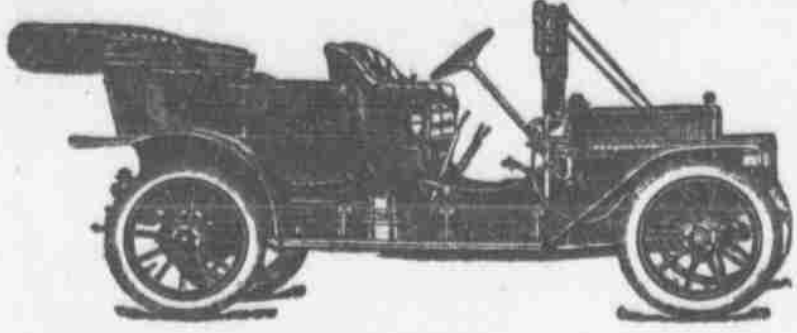

GIVE BOY PLENTY OF PLAY

Dr. Luckey of University Addresses Teachers on Child's Training.

WOULD ORGANIZE HIS PASTIME

Dr. Davidson Thinks Omaha is Backward in Playground Movement—Miss Jonta Shows Progress of Associated Charities.

Nearly every school teacher in Omaha and South Omaha, and others interested in a movement for playgrounds attended the meeting of the Associated Charities.

Dr. Luckey of the University of Nebraska, addressed the meeting on "Should Organized Play Be Made a Regular Part of the Public School Curriculum?"

Children should have organized play, said Dr. Luckey. "It is natural that they should have play, but it is also natural that their play be organized and supervised in a manner that will get for them the most benefit."

"Why do normal children dislike school? Because under the present system, the schools are merely mental factories where knowledge is crammed into the heads of the students. The number of subjects taught might be reduced and those left in the curriculum should be vitalized. This could be done by organizing play, in which the teachers would systematically inspire the pupils to reap the entire benefits of recreation. The teachers also would improve their usefulness by resting a few hours a day from intensive brain labor."

"I would suggest that the entire boy be sent to school, that part of him which needs development only possible from play as well as that part of him that cries out against study alone. I would have the school days from four to six hours long, according to the age of the children, and have the term ten months. I would have the first hour and one-half of the day devoted to organized play and the last hour and one-half of the day devoted to organized play. Intervening between these periods would be the time for intellectual work. I believe under such a system, the health of the children would be greatly promoted and instead of the boy arising in the morning with dislike for school he would be eager to get there, for he would know that he was going to have his play as well as his work."

"One-sided development means subjects for the jails and almshouses. The need of the hour is for large-minded, balanced men." Superintendent Davidson also spoke in favor of public playgrounds. He said that such a movement was of vital interest to the children of Omaha and that at least
