Dr. Newton M. Mann Sunday morning will deliver the last of his series of lectures on schemes of social betterment...

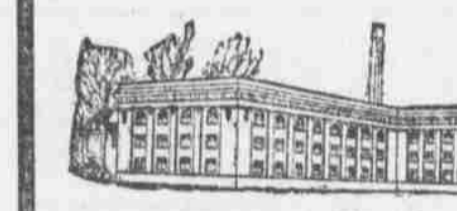
