MOVES UP AS WHEAT MARKET

Also Steps Up in Oats Column and in Receipts of All Grains Goes from Sixth to Fourth Position.

Omaha continues to climb the ladder of the primary grain markets of the world, according to the government report for the month of January, which is just out. The Omaha market moved from sixth to fifth position in the receipts of wheat; it remained in second position in the receipt of corn; it moved from fourth to third position in the receipt of oats and in the total receipts of all grain, moved from sixth to fourth position.
