WIND AND DUST ON WARPATH

Make Life Miserable on the Streets for One Day.

BLOWS BOARDS FROM BUILDING

Planks Are Hurlled to Ground from Towing City National Bank Building and Men Quit Work for a While.

And the temperature was 87 at 3 p. m. "Hey, why don't you look where you're going!"

Two men met in a head-on collision at Sixteenth and Farnam streets. Both had their heads in front of them, trying to breathe the dust. One rammed his derby into the other's face.

Building sand and Nebraska soil in an efficient mixture with a westerly wind of much force, swept down the canons between the buildings along Omaha's streets Wednesday. It was a city-made sand storm that rivalled the best that the alkali plains can produce.

Gathered between the planes of resistance offered by towering walls, the gale gathered strength downtown, driving grit and dust through each tiny crevice to settle in the quiet of the interiors of the buildings. The storm made Wednesday a day of discomfort and discontent.

The overgrown seamy got greatest headway on Farnam street where it was with difficulty that pedestrians could keep footing up the hill.

The police department closed to traffic the streets in the danger zone. Patrolmen guarded the roped boundaries of the district and the streets were closed for a block on either side of the building.

FORTY DAYS OUT OF BOSTON AND DYING FOR BAKED BEANS

The entire party consisted of about eighty persons, fifty of whom were from New England states and the others were from New York and Pennsylvania. F. A. Stockwell, one of the directors of the tour, said that with the exception of a little sprinkle in San Francisco, the party has not seen any rain since it left Boston for the west.
