Marine Expert Makes House to House Canvas

Will Personally Inspect Homes from Which Typhoid Cases Are Reported During Last Month.

Dr. Louis L. Lundsten of the Marine Hospital, who has been investigating the Omaha city water situation, started this afternoon on a personal tour of examination that is out of the ordinary in this section. He will personally inspect the houses and members of families in Omaha, where typhoid fever has occurred during March, and possibly earlier.

dresses of homes, where typhoid has been reported in the last month, and these have been divided into neighborhood groups, for convenience in canvassing. Each individual case will be inquired into with the most minute care by the Marine hospital expert. For this purpose he has prepared a set of blanks, having more than two score questions on them. The replies will cover personal history, family antecedents in a general way, all incidents connected with the daily life of the person, who had the fever, kind of water used, kind and quantity of milk, vegetables, meat, in fact, everything that can have any possible bearing on the typhoid outbreak.

Dr. Lundsten will be engaged in this canvass of patients and their homes for several days, at least, and it is inquired in 100 cases does not bring results satisfactory to his mind he will extend the canvass to 200 cases.

COMET'S TAIL IS SUSPECTED
Devout Demo Terror-Strikes at Fire Flows from Wrath of Mr. Halley.

St. Patrick's to Erect Church

Catholic Parish Decides to Spend Thirty Thousand Dollars in Building New Edifice.

At a meeting of the members of St. Patrick's parish, held Sunday afternoon, a decision was reached to proceed with the preparations for erecting a new church to cost at least \$30,000. It will be erected on the lot where the present edifice stands, at Fourteenth and Casselair streets, and will very likely face Casselair street. The present church faces on Fourteenth street, but by cutting off the rear part of the building room can readily be made to build the new structure on the lot facing Casselair street.

The committee to decide where the new edifice shall stand and to adopt a design for the building, consists of J. H. Nourthon, John Carey, Dan Connell, Tom O'Connell and Father J. T. Smith. The committee on way and means is made up of Dan Connell, William Lyman, Thomas J. Flynn, John Power and D. J. Shanahan. Both committees are to meet Wednesday evening to start the work of organization for the church building campaign.
