"The examiners state," says the report, 'that proper restraints have been placed by the company upon the supply department, where expenditures for legislative and other improper purposes were concealed by the previous management, and that the system in operation at present will prevent the recurrence of such practices."

The returns to policyholders have been increased correspondingly. The dividends paid in 1904 amounted to \$2,674,206 and in 1908 to \$8,311,255. The report explains, however, that one reason for this significant increase lies in the fact that many deferred dividend policies matured during the years 1907-08.
