Garfield Would Be Governor

Former Secretary Receptive Candidate for Nomination in Ohio—Speaks Twice in Des Moines.

DES MOINES, Ia., April 22.—James H. Garfield, former secretary of the Interior, is expected to reach Des Moines today from Denver to speak at the annual meeting of the Grand club tonight on "National Problems." Mr. Garfield addressed the students at Drake university this morning on "The Education of the Future." He is now in Des Moines on his way to Columbus, Ohio, where he was a guest of the Governor's Dinner committee and this afternoon was taken over the city in an automobile. In an interview, Mr. Garfield declared that President Taft is carrying out the Roosevelt conservation policies, stating that Governor Harmon of Ohio is the proper candidate for president, but that he himself is a receptive candidate for governor of Ohio and refused absolutely to discuss the Ballinger-Finchey controversy.
