COTTON SHORTS GIVE NOTICE

Two Hundred Thousand Bales Will Be Delivered Monday.

ALL GOES TO SPINNERS

Leader of Bull Quarter Says None Will Be Sold to Speculators—Fifteen Million Dollars Involved.

NEW YORK, April 29.—This was "notice day" on the cotton exchange and the financial world turned its attention today to the commodity mart to glean news of the settlement of the reported "corner" in May contracts in cotton.

According to estimates shortly before noon the bears in the cotton market at that time had issued notices for the delivery on Monday of 200,000 bales of cotton on May contracts.

Attention is directed to the following decision of the War department under date of April 27, 1910.
