Broken Bow Again Wins Water Suit

Third Trial of Rental Case Which Has Been in Court for Twenty Years Ends.

Broken Bow (Neb., April 28.—Special)—At a special short session of the district court held here Wednesday, Judge Good of Wahoo handed down an important decision in the old water works judgment case against the city, in which he held that the judgments were valid and enjoined any further action to collect on them. This case has become famous by reason of its being in the courts for nearly twenty years. The amount involved, with accumulated interest, reaches over \$10,000. The water works company in 1887 secured a contract to furnish water for fire protection at a specific amount per hydrant. The full legal tax levy of 7 mills did not raise a sufficient amount to pay this rental and in 1890 the city attorney, Harry O'Neill, confessed judgment for \$4,000. The following year the company secured a judgment in the courts for \$12,000 and a year later M. McSherry, as city attorney, confessed judgment for \$1,500. These three judgments, with accumulated interest, amounting to more than \$10,000, have caused all kinds of trouble and much litigation.

Many years ago Taylor Flick brought action to enjoin the collection of these and won his case in the district court, but the supreme court reversed it. Charles W. Young next acquired the judgment from the water works company to compel the assessor to value property in the city at its full value; the case was lost in both courts. An action to compel the mayor and council to make a judgment levy was also lost in both courts.

The present suit to collect these judgments was commenced three years ago before Judge Bruce Hostetter, who lately turned it over to Judge Good for trial. The last suit was commenced when N. T. Gadd was city attorney and lapsed over into the term of A. P. Johnson, who now holds that position. Many prominent attorneys have been drawn into the case in the last twenty years. Judge Elias A. Holcomb was called into the case last fall by the city and produced a brief that was pronounced a master production by legal authorities. No day of appeal to the supreme court has been given.
