Omaha has become innamated with the game ball.

If there is a man or boy who is not going to be out to Vinton street park Tuesday to witness the opening of the home season he has not made the fact known.

Official boys are racking their brains for an excuse to hand to the "home" that will assure them the opportunity to watch the Rockies and Conveys play the opener.

Fans are counting the hours until time for the call of time by the umpire and women fans are getting excited over the big event.

All arrangements have been made for the big parade that will be held before the game and it is thought the procession will be the longest that has ever been held before an Omaha base ball opening.

It will be headed by a platoon of police, followed by a band, six automobiles containing Mayor Doolittle, Dan Butler, Ralph Underwood, D. J. O'Brien, city officials, newspaper men, club officials, the Tophka and Omaha teams will be next in line. Then will come the Ad club and the Elks, in machines. These will be followed by a long line of base ball fans.

Parade at Two O'clock

The parade will form at the corner of Nineteenth and Parnass streets at 2 o'clock, start and will proceed to Sixteenth, turn north to Twelfth, south to Thirteenth, south to Farnham, west to Fifteenth, south to Harney, west to Sixteenth and then south to the ball park.

It is planned to have the procession reach the park at 2 o'clock, where a concert will be given by the band until time for the game. Before the first ball game and between sections by the band, the Elks and Ad club members will put on some stunts for the amusement of the crowd. Both these organizations have reserved large sections of the grandstand and promise a brand of roasting such as has never before been heard in Omaha.

The Elks will meet at the club rooms at 2 o'clock, where machines will be provided for those who will attend the game. The Ad club will assemble its forces at the Parnass hotel and then go to Nineteenth and Parnass streets to get in the parade.

Mayor Doolittle will lead the first ball across the plate or at least somewhere near it. Ralph Underwood will swing at it as it falls and D. J. O'Brien will catch it—probably—and Dan Butler will call it a strike, even if it is not in the immediate vicinity of the bat.

Hawkeye Track Team Wallops the Purple Squad with Wide Margin of Points to Spare.

IOWA CITY, Ia., May 7.—(Special Telegram)—Iowa easily defeated Northwestern today in a dual track meet here today, scoring 66 points to 44. A cold, driving rain almost made it impossible to have the meet and it was with difficulty that the field events were held.

Bradley, the Northwestern sprinter, ran the 100 in ten flat, one of the watches catching it at nine and four-fifths. James clipped off five points for Iowa in the quarter by defeating Captain Shaffer of Northwestern in fifty-two and three-fifths seconds. Best's victory in the mile and Bradley's jump of twenty feet, two inches were the only other first scored by the purple.

Because of the wet ground, Alderman, Iowa's star weight man, could not equal his previous performance and in the hammer, O'Brien sprang a surprise by defeating him with a 132-foot throw. Alderman and Bradley tied for individual honors, with thirty points each. Tallman, in the prettiest race of the day, squeaked out a victory in the 200-yard dash, defeating Bradley by a few inches. Barton, the other Iowa entry, was close to the winners. Wilson ran two pretty hurdle races for Iowa winning only by close margins. Wandrack of Northwestern was tight on the heels of the Hawkeye in both races. He also won second in the discus throw. There were fourteen events, only firsts and seconds counting.
