Edwin Pell of City of Saitillo, Wrecked Near St. Louis, Blamed for Recent Catastrophe,

ST. LOUIS, May 19.-Charges of negligence and inattention to duty today were preferred against Edwin Pell, pilot of the City of Saitillo, wrecked at Glen Park last

Steamboat inspectors sent the official re port of the charges to Washington tonight. It sets forth that Pell will be notified to appear for preliminary trial before the inspectors May 28, and that the Saltillo came to its end "by striking against a rocky shore and sinking."




