NEW RAILROAD TO NORTH

Commercial Club to Ask the Milwaukee to Build to South Dakota.

REWARD OF TRADE EXCURSION

Many New Stations Are Forwarding Grain to Omaha and Jobbers Are Selling New Lines of Goods.

That a railroad is needed between Omaha and eastern South Dakota is the opinion of the executive committee of the Omaha Commercial Club, from information gleaned on the recent trade excursion. That it will be built is also the opinion of the committee.

After setting forth the benefits to be derived from such a line the trade excursion committee in a report to the executive committee says: "When the committee planned this trip it was with the expectation of finding such conditions as outlined and then doing whatever might be necessary to improve them. We therefore recommend that the matter of a 'Milwaukee' line to connect Omaha with the southeastern portion of South Dakota be taken up with the executive head of that company in the proper way at the right time. If this is done and an offer made to give them our assistance in securing terminals in this city, we believe such a line will ultimately be built."

It is possible, so those interested in the project assume, that the Northwestern might extend one of its lines in northeastern Nebraska to meet another at Yankton. However, the Milwaukee territory is the one that the jobbers and manufacturers are the most interested in at this time as it extends over a greater area in that section than the Northwestern.

Although the trade boosters have been home but two weeks, the effect of the trip is being felt. New lines are being introduced into the territory visited and grain men report shipments from many new stations which never did business with Omaha in the past. With a direct line from these points it is estimated that the volume of business done would be immense.

MILK MUST BE BOTTLED UP

Crossed Against Stores Selling Milk Except in Regulation Bottles—Forty Complaints Ready.

The health department is making preparations to war against the grocers and other stockholders of Omaha who sell milk not bottled. The city ordinance implies that all milk sold from stores must be bottled, and it is said by inspectors of the health department that the ordinance is being flagrantly violated. Deputy Inspector Hostie has forty complaints ready to file.
