The property, which consists of a solid group of twelve full sized, unpatedited claims, is located on Mount independence in the Goose range of Mountains in Cassia county, Idaho, approximately twenty-three miles by wagon road south of Albion, the nearest railroad point.

Cwing to the covering of snow not much of the general and topographical geology could be noted, but the geological horizon of this district consists mainly of the older Cambrian and Archean rocks, including quarts lie, quartzite slates, and shists (such as hornblende and micashists) guessa and granites. To the south and west lie the older granites and shists, the later formations of quartzite predominates superposed upon the former.

The ground is of such a nature that it will require very little timbering, although it is good breaking ground and could easily be tunneled by hand work.

All in all, the property has especially good features and warrants further development. A lower tunnel will prove up its value and the better transportation facilities that are being perfected give promise that this property of obvious merit will soon find its way made for scientific and fruitful development.


