WICHITA TEAM KEEPS IT UP

Takes Third Game from Omaha by Dint of Poor Play.

FAST TRIPLE WORKS HAVOC

Captain Schlipke, with Three on Bases and None Out, Bats It Feebly to Westertil—Side Retired.

Omaha lost the third straight game to Wichita by a score of 4 to 2 yesterday afternoon. The Izzles jumped into the lead in the second inning by making two runs off two passes by Rhodes and a single by Shaw, and stayed there all the way.

Omaha had a chance or two to win out, but, as in a number of recent games, the regular sluggers were not able to hit the ball when a hit was absolutely necessary to win a game.

Omaha's one chance that looked exceptionally good was in the eighth, when three were on and not a single Rourke was out. Schlipke hit into a triple play and it was all off. It was a fast triple at that. Welch got first by a single and went to second when Hollenbeck was walked. Jimmy Kane also drew transportation. Then Captain Schipper hit one to Westertil, who came in close to the plate, grabbed it up and slammed it to Shaw, who tagged Welch. Shaw swung the ball on to Izzell, and right skipper. Then the old bald-headed fly slapped the sphere back to Shaw and caught Holly, who was coming in from second at a fast clip. This irritated the Rourkes to a great extent, as the rooters in the grandstand were ready to do anything when the three men were on to get a score. Silence reigned supreme after the fast work by the visitors.
