Local Showers Reported in North Dakota Wheat Country.

WHEAT IS WEAK AND LOWER

Corn Market is Stubborn and Holds Firm in the Face of Weaker Wheat and Ideal Growing Weather.

OMAHA, June 30.—WHEAT—Spot, local showers reported in North Dakota wheat country.

Local showers were reported in North Dakota where the warm dry weather continues to originate.

Some of the grain dealers of last week have turned sellers on the opinion that the advance has been too steady and is unwarranted.

The strength of corn was due entirely to covering by shorts, having been liberal with the expectation of freer country offerings which did not materialize.

Weakness was again in day. Selling was of blemish and good char-

acter on reported scattered rains in the North Dakota district. It was noted that the drouth was broken and that with favorable conditions, damage might have been overestimated.

The market setts stubborn and holds firm in face of weaker wheat and ideal growing weather in the corn belt. Country selling has been disappointing and local buyers are in a bind.

Primer wheat receipts were 30,600 bushels, and shipments were 25,000 bushels. Males 100,000 bushels, and shipments of 13,000 bushels.

Primary corn receipts were 30,000 bushels and shipments were 30,000 bushels; receipts of 100,000 bushels, and shipments of 45,000 bushels.

Clearances were 8,000 bushels of corn, 100 bushels of oats and wheat and flour equal to 10,000 bushels.

Liverpool closed 1½d lower on wheat and ½d higher on corn.

CHICAGO GRAIN AND PROVISIONS

Features of the Trading and Closing Prices on Board of Trade.

CHICAGO, June 30.—Wall street weakness appeared to be the main factor, as the same cause was exactly the opposite in the first stages of the northwestern crop scare. Extension of the fallow field was the chief that the grain trade is now fearing on the wherewithal to handle the coming crops. General selling of wheat had another powerful reason, a general breaking of the drouth which has threatened the yield in the Dakotas and Minnesota. Corn and oats, however, were lower. Corn and oats, respectively, showed losses of 5¢ and 2¢. Provisions were unchanged or down.

The market rallied, but in every instance the price weakened and worked lower. The official forecast was for showers and cooler weather in the corn and wheat region and no important change in temperature has occurred since the last report.
