Nebraska Faces a Serious Problem in Caring for Its Insane Patients-Douglas County Hospital in Also Full.

Nebraska faces a serious problem in the matter of caring for insane patients who fall upon the mercy of the state. A few days ago Robert Smith, clerk of the district court and a member of the Douglas County Insanity commission, wrote to Governor Shallenberger, calling to his attention the inadequacy of the Douglas County hospital and the lack of accommodations for the incane. A reply was received Thursday morning. The governor states that all state institutions are ercwded to their capacity and that the increasing number of insane persons for whom the state must provide is demanding, more and more, that further provision be made. A paragraph from the governor's letter says:

Our state institutions for the insane are very much overcrowded at present. There has been one building completed at Norfolk, which has somewhat relieved the situation there and another is being completed, I understand, at Hastings. Everyone of our institutions are crowded beyond measure, and it seems as though, the state is confronted with the fact that these unfortunate people are constantly increasing in numbers that must be cared for by the state. I will endeavor at once to relieve the situation as much as I can."

Many of our subscribers have asked us how it is possible for the receiver of the independent Telephone company to go ahead with construction work and develop the property when the company itself was unable so to do. A little explanation will make this perfectly clear. The present suit was brought to foreclose the mortgage securing the bonds. A public service corporation owes such a cuty to the public that it cannot stop doing business. Its franchise requires it to give certain service to the public. That these franchise requirements be carried out the court in this case appointed Lysie I. Abbott as receiver in order that he in that capacity might operate the plant of the telephone company pending the sale in foreclosure.

The old company could do no additional construction work because its income was not sufficient to provide funds for that purpose. The suprems court of the United States has said that it is the duty of a court in a case of this kind to preserve the property for the homoholders. Here was a large investment which was non-productive because incomplete. Business men want telephones over which they can reach their lusbands' places of business. In order to make this property productive and to preserve it for the bondholders it was deemed necessary to do certain construction work. The court appointing the receiver in view of these circumstances ordered the construction of an exchange in South Omaha and also one in Florence. This work was immediately undertaken and is now well along towards completion. It involves the laying of underground cables for almost five miles, sufficiently large to permit 300 conversations to pass between South Omaha and Omaha at the same time.
