Gold Formality Marks Meeting of Police Board

Request of Commissioner Charles Karbach Ignored at First Gathering Since Charges.

The request of Charles Karbach, member of the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners, to have himself declared absent at the last meeting of the board was denied by his fellow members at the meeting Friday afternoon and that one disagreement was all that marred the gold formality of the first meeting that has been held since Karbach swore to his sensational charges against his colleagues and the chief of police.

Mr. Karbach declared that he was absent at the meeting which confirmed the appointment of Morris as fire warden and asked to have the records which declared him present rectified. No one would move to change the records and on Mr. Wappich's motion they were approved as they stood. It is believed that Karbach will be absent on record as absent at the appointment of Morris because he disapproved of that action. His unsuccessful efforts to get someone else in as fire warden are said to have been back of his attack upon the chief of police of the board.

Two protests, one from the city Christian Endeavor union and one from the Dundee Presbyterian church, were received asking that fight pictures be prohibited in Omaha. They were placed on file.

PRIZES FOR STATE PLAYERS

Special Inducements Are Offered for Nebraska Players to Enter the Tournament—Courts Are Being Fixed Up.

Entries for the National Tennis tournament, which is to start in Omaha Monday, are coming in slowly but steadily, and the outlook for the city will see the best and biggest meet in that sport that ever came here. At 9 o'clock Monday morning the playing will start, and on that date almost 100 names are expected to be on the board as contestants for honors in the singles, Saturday evening at 8 o'clock the list will be closed and the drawings held some time that evening or Sunday.

During the latter part of this week the courts at the field club are closed to players all the morning hours and given up to the caretakers to work on new nets and new paint have been supplied, and on Monday the sun will rise on one of the finest equipped places for tennis in the United States. Only one thing is worrying the committee as to the best possible management of the tournament, and that is the necessity of having more umpires to take charge of the contests. Conrad Young, the chairman, is extending an invitation to all men who know tennis in the city, who would like to act in this capacity to enter their names and the courtesy of the club which is to be the umpire.

He is entered in the doubles with a Brooklyn player, whose name he did not send with his. Olin J. Sweet, champion of Des Moines, will be here, and possibly W. T. Hayes, holder for four years of the middleweight championship. C. S. Peters, champion of Illinois, will come with him if he comes.

The number of Nebraska and Omaha men entered is very small up to date, compared to the number who have come to the midwestern contests held heretofore. The idea of having a city cup for the Nebraska players to compete for did not even attract a great many of them, the general impression seeming to be that they would have no chance against the more experienced men coming from other cities. Speaking of this, urge all who are able to do so to enter, as Omaha is desirous of making a good showing of western men against the eastern and Pacific coast players.
