CORN ALSO SUFFERS A FALL

Receipts of Wheat Were Large for Week and Selling Became Active on Exchange—Cash Market Was Lower.

OMAHA, AUG. 1.—Sentiment among wheat traders is becoming more bearish until after the movement of new wheat is over. Harvesting returns have proved better than early indications and cash buyers are heading a volume of new wheat on the market, which is having a depressing effect.

Primary wheat receipts were 2,574,000 bushels and shipments 1,712,000 bushels. Primary corn receipts were 61,000 bushels and shipments 42,000 bushels.
