INDIANAPOLIS, Aug. 16.-Attempts to put through the special national convention of the United Mine Workers an indorsement of the Illinois strike failed yesterday when President Thomas Lewis ruled every motion out of order.

"There will be no railroading done in this convention," declared Lewis after the third attempt to get a motion indorsing the strike before the convention.

Frank Hayes of Illinois, vice president of the international organization, created the sensation of the afternoon session by declaring that the international organization was on the brink of financial ruin and was facing the crisis of its existence. He blames lack of harmony among the district and international officials for the present

President White of the Iowa district, declared the calling of the special convention a monumental blunder, and ended his speech by urging that the Illinois strike be indorsed, saying that an indorsement of the various strikes now in progress would do the organization more good than several ssessments, as it would show the operators that the miners were united.




