Wheat Lacks Snap, Demand Being Poor Tuesday. CASY VALUES ARE LOWER

Heavy Receipts and Weak Purchasing Force Prices Down—Corn Also Suffers a Decline. OMAHA, Aug. 16, 1910.

Without the support of heavy buying by European markets on this day, prices are expected to find lower levels. Receipts of wheat were 1,423,000 bu., against receipts last year of 870,000 bu., and shipments of 1,000,000 bu.

Provisions were strong most of the day. Pork was 10c higher, and lard 1c higher. Corn was 1/2c higher, and soybeans 1/2c higher.
