### STATE SOLDIERS TO CAMP

Three Omaha Companies Prepare to Leave for Fort Riley.

#### REGIMENTAL OFFICERS ALSO GO

Soldiers Will Be Accompanied by the First Regiment Band—To Be Gone Twelve Days and Expect to Enjoy It.

One hundred and seventy officers and men of three Nebraska National Guard companies will leave Omaha Wednesday morning at 8 on a special Union Pacific train for Fort Riley, Kan. To take part in the big midsummer maneuvers held there under the direction of the United States Army.

The three companies are I, G and L. Their officers being as follows:

Company I (Thurston Rifles), Captain E. F. Blomster commanding; first lieutenant, C. H. Barnester; second lieutenant, Fred Schultz.

Company G (Dahlman Rifles), Captain E. E. Sterriker commanding; first lieutenant, Eugene I. Harris; second lieutenant, C. W. Stein.

Company L (Millard Rifles), Captain Julius Wieg commanding; first lieutenant, Gus Wieg; second lieutenant, Herbert Vohberg.

Three regimental officers will be on the train. These are Lieutenant Colonel W. E. Ober, Captain and Battalion Adjutant Joseph A. Lillie and Captain and Commissary T. E. Lowe. Also three military companies of the engineer corps, Captain Otto Haesman, First Lieutenant J. E. Maxwell and Second Lieutenant Edward Pienan, will be aboard. The Omaha companies will muster from fifty to fifty-four men each and are in condition to make a highly creditable showing. They will be gone twelve days, returning home Saturday, August 21.

The guardsmen expect to have an even more strenuous time than at a state encampment and the maneuvers will keep them pretty consistently on the go.

Besides the Omaha companies traveling on this train there will be the First regiment band of Omaha and at Abilene will be picked up the companies from Abilene, Beuyler and Fremont. The Bloomfield, Neb., bunch will be taken on at the Union station here.

First Problem in Maneuvers. FUNCTION CITY, Kan., Aug. 16.—The working out of the first military problem of the fall maneuvers at Fort Riley began today with 1,500 men of the Kansas militia, under command of Brigadier General Charles P. Crew and Brigadier General Charles I. Merrin of Topeka taking part. The first assignment the troops to the reservation the problem is one which necessitates a minimum of marching. Recent rains have done much to put the ground of Pawnee flats, where the maneuvers are staged, in good condition. The Nebraska troops are expected in camp tomorrow.
