**WEST FARNAM AGAIN SCARED**

Rumor of Colored Church on Dewey Avenue Agitates Residents.

**SOME DO NOT GIVE CREDENCE**

Meeting to Be Held on the Grocery Store Project Will Also Consider the Question of the Church Rumor.

Residents of upper Dewey avenue are in a flutter because of a large, life-sized rumor that a colored people's church is to be established in their aristocratic midst. Men owning homes in the neighborhood mentioned, the intersection of Dewey and Thirty-fifth, are in a state of violent agitation and conferring with one another regarding holding a meeting, buying up the property and whatever else can be done.

One or two calmer men, including E. S. Westbrook, secretary of the Transmississippi Cream company, are taking the matter more lightly.

"I don't think there is anything in it at all," said Mr. Westbrook, whose home is at Thirty-fifth and Harney streets, a block away from the alleged scene of Afro-American designs.

"It looks to me," added Mr. Westbrook, "like an attempt to work an old game—to stampede a neighborhood into buying property at a high price. So far as I can learn this colored church talk has its origin in the enterprising mind of a 'sour stone' real estate broker. The price mentioned is \$100 the front foot, or \$5,000 for the lot. Now, show me a colored congregation which has \$5,000 to put into building property."

"Let 'em buy it," continued Mr. Westbrook. "Have we any objection to respectable colored citizens coming along and building a church in our neighborhood? Of course not—when the price is beyond their means. It is only a bluff and nothing will come of it."

Meeting Friday Night. Mr. Westbrook had not heard what other men in the neighborhood had, that there was to be a meeting Friday night at his home to discuss ways and means. When the more agitated residents of the neighborhood, hears of his skepticism, either they will be converted and their alarm quieted or else they will hold the meeting somewhere else.

No colored folk reside in the immediate neighborhood at present and no particular

Work on Union Pacific Headquarters and New Postoffice Building to Be Pushed.

Some fast work is to be done by the contractors on the new postoffice station on Tenth and Marcy streets. Work in tearing down the outside stairway of the Union station was begun Thursday morning and will be pushed rapidly.

The new building will stand where the Avery Manufacturing company and the H. Herschel Manufacturing company now have the entrance walk into their buildings and will necessitate the buying of another walk space by these companies.

T. C. Madden, who is laying the foundation for the new headquarters of the Union Pacific building, is almost done driving the piles and Clem Dunlap of the James Stewart company will take charge of the erecting of the building itself inside of a couple of weeks.

The foundations being laid in are a combination of steel and cement laid on piles driven some thirty and forty feet into the ground.
