POLICE HOSPITAL IS PLAN

Health Commissioner Connell and Dr. Harris Advance Idea.

WOULD TRANSFORM "BULL PEN"

New Scheme is to Build Commodious Department with Ward, Nurses and Big Equipment—Two Surgeons Leave.

If the plans of Health Commissioner R. W. Connell and Police Surgeon R. B. Harris carry, Omaha will have a special police station hospital and surgical rooms before another year has passed. Enormous hospital bills upon the city every year and wretchedly inadequate surgical quarters at the station brought about the plan.

Will Import Surgeon.

The little surgeon's department at the station has been in so sadly a crippled state during the last few days that Surgeon Harris was forced to send to Portland, Ore., for Dr. O. C. Bishop, who was called last night from the city to attend to a patient who was brought to the city today.

Hope for Elaborate Equipment.

A commodious department of several rooms, a ward, a nurse, bed and all the wonderful luxuries that former police surgeons only saw in dreams is the hope of the local staff. In the proposed hospital all the major operations which now go to St. Joseph's hospital, could be carried out. There have been 6,700 such cases in the last five years, not to mention countless lesser cases.

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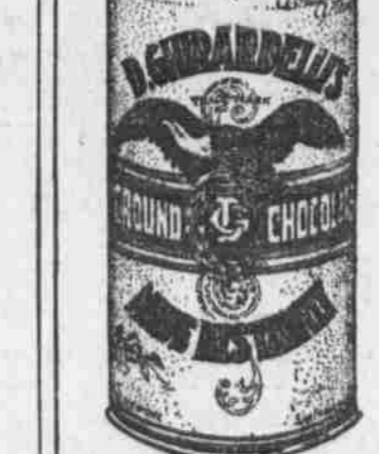
