

UNIVERSITY OF OMAHA OPEN

Fitting Exercises Mark the Beginning of the Fall Term.

SIXTY STUDENTS ARE ENROLLED

New Gymnasium is Well Under Way—Several Prominent Men Make Short, Impressive Speeches During Big Program.

The second year of the Omaha university was begun with exercises in Redick hall at Twenty-fourth and Pratt streets Tuesday morning.

Judge Kennedy Talks. Judge Kennedy, on behalf of the board of directors, said that body feels the fact that this school begins its second year with an enrollment of sixty is something which has brought joy to their hearts.

Dr. Davidson brought out the thought that the great aim in life should be usefulness and service to our fellowmen and to the state.

Dr. Curry, one of the first to conceive of establishing a college in Omaha, said: "If any one had told me six years ago that a college would now be starting under such auspicious surroundings, I would have thought him beside himself."

The Union Stock Yards company furnished thirty healthy hogs for inoculation and treatment with serum.

The experiments were successful in South Omaha, hog cholera is a thing of the past in Nebraska.

The special meeting of the Swine Breeders' association resulted and this organization will begin at once a campaign to equip a state office to supply the serum direct to the swine breeders.

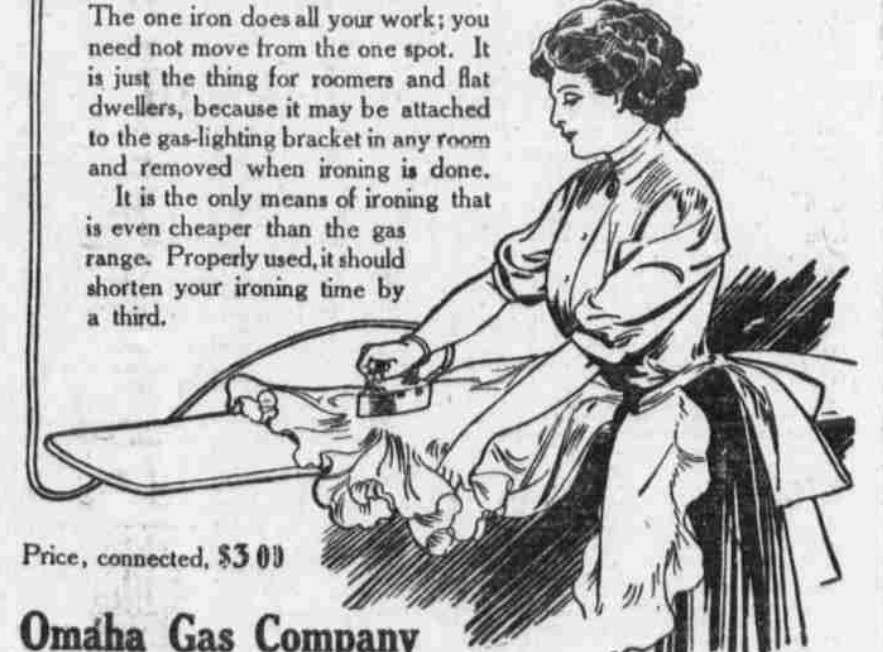
