Death Record. Mrs. O. F. Westlund. MASON CITY, Sept. 13.—(Special.)—The body of Mrs. O. F. Westlund, who died Saturday in St. Louis, reached this city today. Washburn Lands to Be Sold. WASHINGTON, Sept. 13.—What is declared to be the largest auction sale of lands ever offered at one time will take place on the Crow (Montana) and the (Utah) Indian reservations on October 15 and November 1 next, respectively. About 1,000,000 acres of land, suitable principally for dry farming and grazing, are involved in the sale.

Will Retire from Office. Judge James A. Howe, of the district bench, and Charles A. Lyon, assistant attorney general, will form a partnership at the close of their respective terms at the end of the year, and engage in the practice of law. Both have declined to remain longer in office. The nomination papers were filed today by W. G. Blood of Keokuk as a candidate for judge of the district court in Lee county, in opposition to Judge Henry Bank, democrat and present incumbent.

Arkansas Returns Incomplete. Palauki County Goes Wet by Majority of Six Hundred. LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Sept. 13.—Returns from yesterday's state election are still incomplete. The democratic state ticket, however, has been elected by a majority ranging from 15,000 to 20,000. Constitutional amendment No. 10, providing for the initiative and referendum, has probably carried, although by a much smaller majority than estimated yesterday. Late returns indicate that in Pulaski county, including the city of Little Rock, license carried by a majority of 600. It is claimed that several counties that voted "dry" last year will show a majority for license when the full returns are recorded.

Arizona Goes Democratic. Party Controls Constitutional Convention by Good Majority. PHOENIX, Sept. 13.—A complete return from yesterday's election of delegates to the Arizona constitutional convention confirms the overwhelming victory of the democrats. They have elected a total of 100 delegates out of 200, the republican ticket having elected 100 and the five delegates were still in doubt.
