TO CHANGE FOREST RESERVE

Petition for Opening Large Tract Near Rapid City, S. D., to Homesteaders.

RAPID CITY, S. D., Sept. 17 .- (Special.) -Petitions asking for a change in the oundary of the Black Hills forest re serve are being circulated in Rapid City and Pennington county. The east line of the reserve now runs six miles west of Rapid City. The petition asks for the change of the line so it will run near Silver City, twenty-five miles west of Rapid City. If this petition is granted by the government it will throw open for settlement many fine valleys and will lead to the settlement of the hills country west of Rapid City. At this time there are few people living in the hills west of this city, but the territory in question is capable of sustaining a large number of people and it will be but a short time in settling up, if the boundary of the reserve is changed as prayed for in the petition.


