

COMMERCIAL CONGRESS CALL

Official Notice is Issued for Trans-Mississippi Gathering. WILL MEET AT SAN ANTONIO Many Men of Note Will Speak at Convention Which for Twenty Years Has Aided Development of West.

SAN ANTONIO, Tex., Sept. 19.—An official notice has been issued for the Trans-Mississippi Commercial Congress, which is scheduled to meet in San Antonio, Tex., on November 22, and the announcement is being scattered broadcast throughout the middle West. Commercial clubs, boards of trade, chamber of commerce and the various other civic organizations together with members of clubs and societies of states are being invited to get busy at once and select delegates to the convention.

President Men to Attend. Among the men of note who will appear on the program at the coming convention are: Wm. C. Clegg, secretary of state; Hon. John Barrett, director of the Pan-American bureau; William J. Bryan, Arnold Shanklin, counsel general to Mexico; and others.

Second year of the national congress in cooperation with the Trans-Mississippi congress has been a potent factor in western development during the last twenty years. It constitutes a "free forum" for the west, where governmental policies, projects of commercial and industrial development and the best means for their realization may be freely discussed. The organization represents at its meetings the crystallized commercial sentiment of the states west of the Mississippi.

South American Coming. The delegates to the convention feel free to discuss any subject affecting the general welfare of the trans-Mississippi states. The department of foreign affairs of the United States transmitted the formal invitation of the congress to the republics of Latin America, and acceptance has been received from a number of the governments equipped with the advice that should be carefully represented at the San Antonio convention.

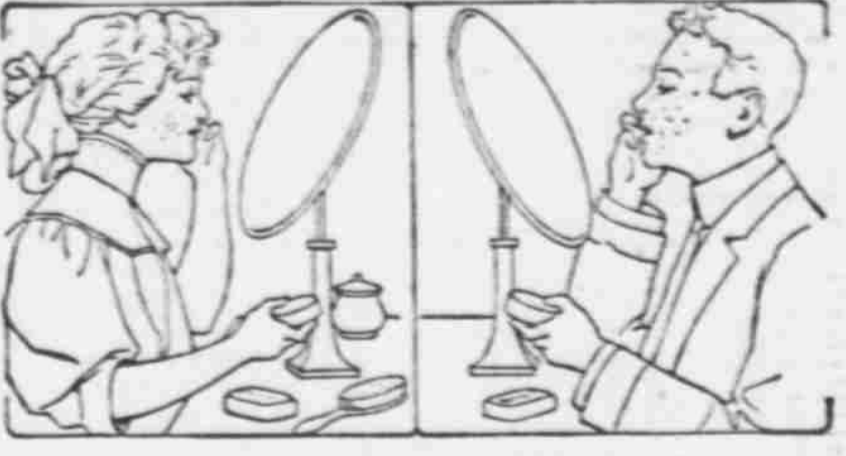
Taft is for Purification
