

DANES HAVE SESSION

Executive Officers of Danish Brotherhood Hold Meeting.

TALK OF PROPERTY AFFAIRS

All Day Tuesday Trains Bring in Delegates Enroute to Conventions of Brotherhood at Fresno, Cal., October 3.

An executive session of the officers of the Danish Brotherhood of America was held in the office of J. Michaelson, national secretary of that order in the Paxton block Tuesday morning, and several important property matters relating to holdings of the order in Florida and the south were settled. The officers are in Omaha on their way to Fresno, Cal., where the national convention meets October 2.

Omaha was the home of the original lodge, No. 1, of the Danish Brotherhood and as the order was founded here the delegates are taking time to stop off and meet with Omaha Danes.

All day Tuesday trains brought them in in groups from the east and they were met by a reception committee at the depot and at Washington hall, the local headquarters, under the chairmanship of Frank Rasmussen. Last evening a reception and entertainment were given them at the hall, and today a trolley ride.

All the officers were present at the Tuesday morning meeting except T. P. Nielsen, a trustee, of Seattle, who will be at the convention. The others were H. H. Vogt, president, Davenport; N. M. Larsen, vice president, Racine; B. Rasmussen, treasurer, Chicago; Henry Gjyosen, trustee, St. Paul; Fred Petersen, trustee, Council Bluffs; and J. Michaelson, secretary, Omaha.

There are five lodges in Omaha and South Omaha, and each will have representation and will send several members as a delegation. A special train will take the 200 that will gather here Wednesday night, and others will be taken en route here and Fresno. The western Nebraska delegation will join at Denver.

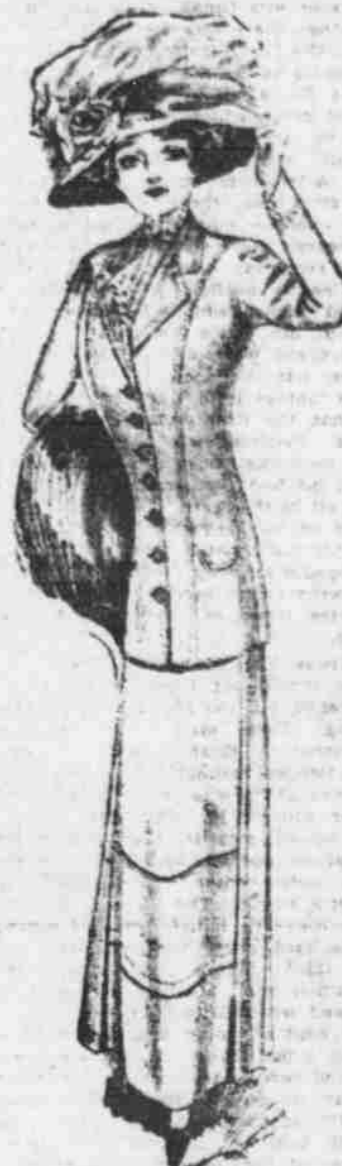
