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LANCASTER COUNTY IMPOSES

District Court Clerk Shows How it Uses Insane Hospital.

THROWS BURDEN ON THE STATE

Clerk Smith Has Figures to Effect that Lancaster Dumps All its County Cases Upon the Shoulders of the State.

Lancaster county is using the state hospital for the insane as a county institution upon which are thrust all the burdens that are ordinarily borne by county tax payers.

The state of Nebraska must have a new hospital for the insane very soon now," said Mr. Smith, "and if the Douglas county delegation to the legislature would stand for one there would be no difficulty in getting it located here.

The following figures, collected for the Douglas county commissioner in 1909, are still typical of the condition, and they show the relative shares of the state's expenditure for the insane, dipso-maniacs and feeble minded:

Douglas county, containing Omaha and having the metropolitan difficulty of being a dumping place for undesirable persons from other counties, has 31.7 per cent of the total population of the state, pays 24.7 per cent of the total state taxes and has sent 23.7 per cent of the patients confined at Lincoln.

Douglas county is crowded out of the Lincoln asylums by previous arrivals from Lancaster county, and the Douglas county hospital, supported by Douglas county funds, has fifty patients to take care of that would have some chance of progress if they could be taken to Lincoln.

"The patients we have here are mostly old and feeble-minded people," says Mr. Smith, "and they do not have such a great need for expert care, but if they could be put in some larger place, they would have a better chance for recovery. The county hospital is simply not big enough to care for them decently."

The figures quoted, which were compiled some time ago, led Mr. Smith to send a communication to the county commissioners asking for an effort to get a new asylum located in this county. The figures show that the other counties in the district from which the Lincoln asylum receives patients are all paying more taxes in proportion to the number of patients than the larger communities, as the percentage of insanity to population is much smaller.

The report, which was compiled by John Lewis, concludes as follows:

"There is no law for, nor does the superintendent use any basis in apportioning the number of patients to be admitted from each county in the district. The superintendent says he admits a patient as soon as he has room for him no matter what county in the district he is from, but will not admit a patient from outside the district without orders from the board."

"I will observe by this report that Lancaster is away ahead of all other counties using the hospital for a regular county hospital, as both their commitments and releases far exceed ours when compared with the population and amount of taxes paid."

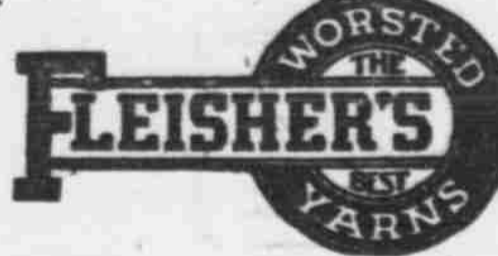

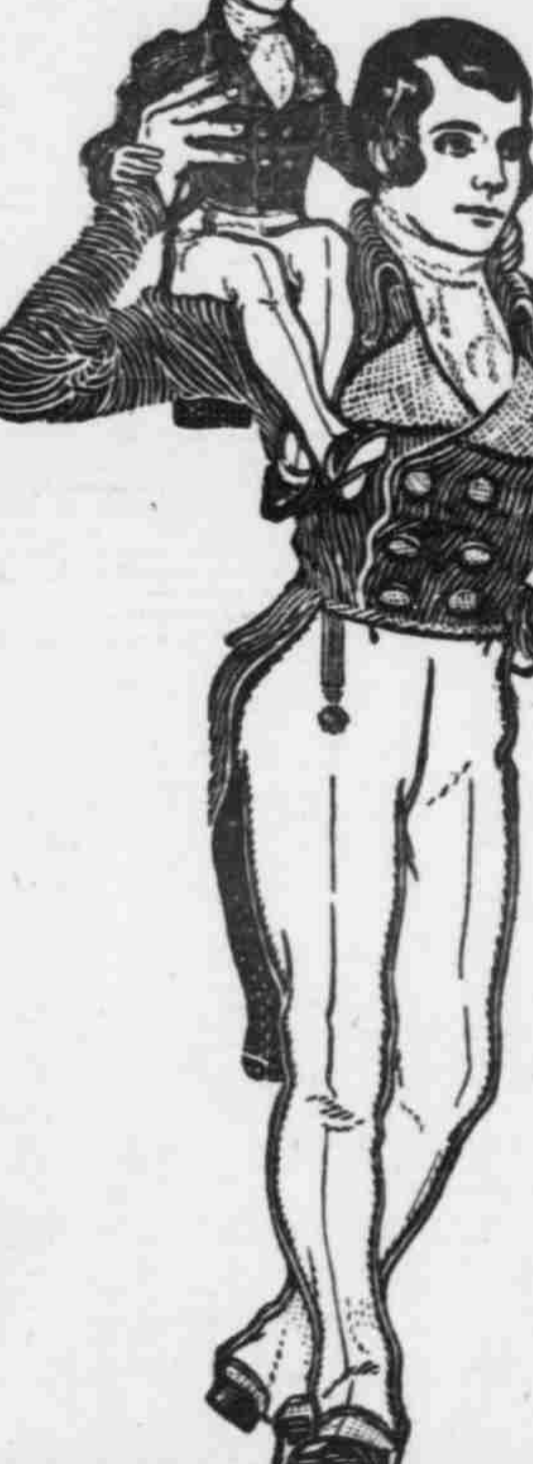
