### Woman's Work

Activities of the Organized Societies Along the Lines of Undertaking of Concern to Women.

The first meeting of the year was held at 2:30 Monday afternoon.

The Rev. Howard Clouse of Mt. View, Okla., introduced three Indians from his Indian church. These men sang an Indian hymn, then Mr. Saucio gave an address in sign language. Mr. Toybo acted as interpreter and Mr. Hobeys, also an Indian, spoke.

Then followed the reports of the several committees. It was decided to entertain at breakfast October 24 at the Henshaw in honor of Mrs. Phillip Moore of St. Louis, national president of the federation. Plates will be 15 and the time is 10 a. m.

The election of delegates to the state federation meeting October 27 at Tecumseh was deferred until the next meeting.

The president, Mrs. M. D. Cameron, gave a very interesting address, emphasizing the necessity of united effort among club members to further departmental work. Co-operation, not competition is to be the watchword of the club, she said. She also said that such questions as civil reform, humanitarian and altruistic movements are spoken in a great wheel which revolves around the limb, which is the child and the home. A womanly, mild, tactful, kindly attitude was recommended in carrying on the work of last year, reform, conservation, education and legislative work.

The program for the afternoon consisted of reports from the several delegates to the biennial at Cincinnati, O.

Mrs. Edgar Allan gave her "Impressions of the biennial." She spoke particularly of the conservation of natural resources.

Mrs. W. F. Harford talked of the conservation of vital forces, such as health and strength. She gave an able resume of the speech of Miss Mary Rauch of Colorado university.

Miss Jessup gave the biennial from an artistic and musical standpoint.

Mrs. David Cole, the retiring state president, praised the work of the Nebraska delegation, saying that the art and household economics departments received national attention.

Mention was made of a gift by Mrs. Stoddard to the state federation. Two hundred dollars is placed at the disposal of the scholarship committee.

Mrs. Weaver, a former Omaha woman, now residing in Portland, spoke of the work of that branch of the club.
