To be effective the inspection must be thorough. To stamp out infectious diseases altogether would require daily inspection of every child and that ould be done only if we had one or two

aspectors for each school building. which a child had diphtheria and croup and in a very bad condition was lying sick were going to school as usual. When such things are done we must have a daily inspection to avoid contagion.

How to Get Information.

My plan is to have the teacher in every class sak just after roll call how many children have sick brothers and sisters at Those that report Illness are to be sent home immediately with a card which is to be filled out by parents or physicians and returned the same day or the next In cases where the disease is contagious child is not allowed to return to where there is extreme poverty the city physician is asked to provide help.

'In this way we can get information every day concerning the health of every child and the dangers to which it may be exposed and prompt action can be taken in every case."

Superintendent of Instruction Davidson declared that the plan proposed met with his hearty support and said that it would be in fact an extension of the system already in use.

Superintendent's Position.

"The position in which I was placed by the doctors," said Mr. Davidson, "was one which they manufactured for me and then proceeded to demolish. I believe very emphatically in a department of hygiene for the schools, but it must be in the charge if a real physician-not an undergraduate half-educated doctor.

At present the schools are the best agency there is for stamping out contagion. As soon as contagious disease is noted by the health department my office is notified and word is sent out to the principals of all schools where exposed children are likely to come and if they bave been exposed they are sent home. 
