FRENCH STRIKE CALLED OFF

Stringent Measures by Government Causes Collapse of Movement.

BOMB OUTRAGES ARE COMMON

Passenger at Versailles Narrowly Escapes Destruction by Infernal Machine—City is Shaken by Force of Explosion.

PARIS, Oct. 18.—The strike committee of the railroad union at a meeting tonight formally called off the strike of the railroad employees, which has extended over several of the most important systems in France. Work will be resumed on all lines tomorrow.

The collapse of the strike was primarily due to the stringent measures taken by Premier Briand, who called to the colors the majority of the strikers, thus compelling them to do service as reservists. The premier also placed under arrest many of the strike leaders and used the military forces without restraint for the protection of life and property.

So great was the force of the explosion that all Versailles was shaken. Thousands of people rushed to the scene and police guards were immediately strengthened along the line.

English Extend Acceptance of Bills of Lading

British Banker Announces a Two Months' Renewal of Terms in Handling Cotton.

NEW YORK, Oct. 18.—An extension from October 21 to December 21 of the period during which American cotton bills of lading will be accepted in current terms by foreign banks was announced here tonight by Sir Edward H. Hoogen, the English banker, who came to this country for the Brush and Continental interests.

The favor with which the plan to have bills of lading guaranteed or insured has been received by interior bankers in this country justified Sir Edward, he said, in urging an extension of the status quo, as probably two months will be required to perfect the project.

In granting the extension the English bankers reserve the right to renew conferences with American financiers to devise some other scheme for safeguarding bills of lading in event the guaranty plan proves impracticable.

BIG SAVINGS BY OFFICIALS

Bank Accounts Show Large Deposits on Ordinary Salaries.

EVIDENCE ON CAR REPAIR GRAFT

Bank Fails to Produce Books Ordered and Attorneys Cannot Submit Complete Figures for Ira G. Rawn.

CHICAGO, Oct. 18.—The bank account of six former Illinois Central officials whose names have been mentioned in connection with extensive car repair grafts, were introduced as evidence today in the trial of Frank B. Harriman, Charles L. Ewing and John M. Taylor in the municipal court. Counsel for the prosecution submitted accounts to show that William Renshaw, receiving a salary of \$7,500 a year as superintendent of machinery, had deposited \$338,666.12 in four years in the Illinois Trust and Savings bank of Chicago and that Charles L. Ewing, who received a salary of \$6,000 a year from the Illinois Central, had deposited \$238,000 in a period of about four years.

Lawyers for the railroad companies stated they were unable to submit complete figures for Ira G. Rawn, because the Continental and Commercial National bank had not yet produced accounts ordered by the court.

In nearly every case the bank accounts of the former Illinois Central officials have been closed. In one or two instances a small balance remains.

The accounts, covering a period from December, 1906, or January, 1908, to about the middle of the present year, show deposits as follows to the six men: William Renshaw, \$358,666.12; Frank B. Harriman, \$295,844.30; Charles L. Ewing, \$238,000.00; Joseph E. Buker, \$107,130.87; Ira G. Rawn, \$106,812.00; John M. Taylor, \$22,115.00.

Of these six men Rawn received first \$15,000 as general manager of the railway and later \$30,000 a year as vice president; Harriman was paid \$10,000 per annum; Renshaw's yearly salary was \$7,500; Ewing's salary was \$6,000; Buker got \$4,000 and Taylor \$3,000 per year.
