FORTY-SEVEN PAIRS OF GATES

Sixty Thousand Tons of Steel Required to Buffd firent Locks that Will Be Used in the

Caunt.

PITTABURG, Oct. se - Mischievous boys dreaming tonight of gates they will seize wildest nightmare tmagine such enormous gates as are being made in Pittsburg for the Panama canal. They will be largest gates in the world. Any one of the pinetyiwo of them, for there are to be forty-six pairs in all, will be about as high as a six-story building, as wide (sixty-five feet) as many city buildings are and seven feet deep or thick. The structural steel that will go to make them will weigh 49,000 tons. or more than eight times as much as was

used to build the Elffel tower in Paris.
