Boston Judge is Threatened

Justice Receives Letter from Chicago Saying He Will Be Killed if He Punishes Labor Leaders.

BOSTON, Mass., Nov. 19 .- A threat of .\$2,607,659.20 death in the event of the officers of the Photo-Engravers union being given jail sentences next Monday for contempt of court, is said to have been contained in a 8.761.49 letter received by one of the justices of the 200,000.00 Massachusetts superior court. The letter 28,527.16 was mailed from Chicago and purported to 68,091.64 be signed by a labor committee of that city.

Both Judges Richardson and Pierce have 4,757.54 dealt with several cases that have arisen 63.75 out of attempts to unionize the engravers shops in Boston and last Monday Judge 7.197.14 Pierce continued the contempt proceedings 2,045.01 until next Monday, stating that if the strike of the photo engravers had not been called off by that time some of the defendants would be dealt with accordingly.
