Famous Fighter at One Time Had Bank Account of \$375,000, but Packard, Columbus...

Died with No Money.

Jem Mace, the last of the old school of prize fighters, died recently at Jarrow. where he had been staying for the past few weeks. The deceased was in his eightieth year.

It can truly be said of Jem Maco, says the Pall Mall Gazette, that he was as famous in his day as any prize fighter the world has ever known. He was born on April 8, 1831, and he engaged in his first important fight when 24 years of age. In fact he beat Slasher Slacy in nine rounds, but in those days the facilities for pugilistic encounters were not quite so great as they are today and it was not until about eighteen months later that he met Bill Thorne, whom Mace defeated after a con-

test which lasted for eighteen rounds. His next fight was a losing one, for he was beaten in two rounds by Bob Brettle. That was in September, 1858, but the following January Mace made amends and regained the confidence of his admirers by beating Fosh Price in eleven rounds.

In 1862 Mace met Tom King in January for £200 and the championship, and beat him after a terrible contest, which lasted for forty-three rounds. The men met again in the same year, when, in November, King turned the tables on his opponent in twenty-one rounds, Mace's next appearance in a contest for the championship was in 1866, when he drew with Joe Goss. He had beaten Goss three years before, and when they met again. Mace defeated his old opponent in twenty-one rounds.

In 1867 Mace contested the title and a purse of 1200 a sile with E. Baidwin, the bout onding in a draw, but in 1870 when he was nearly 40 years of age, old Jem beat T. Allen in a contest for the championship of the world in America, and, a year later, he made his just appearance in a championship fight. He was then over 40 years of age but had the satisfaction of effecting a draw after twelve rounds with Joe Coburn.

Like all of his calling, Mace at one time had been a rich man. In an interview only Sage, Minneapolis a year or so ago he remarked that he had as much as £75,000 to his credit in the

bank, and, further, that he had kept his own stable of race horses.

The old plightst said that he had been accustomed to fighting all his life, his carliest battles being among the jockey boys at the fairs. When he won his first fight, he was only about H years of age. His toughest encounter was with a Stalybridge man many years after.. He and his opponent fought for six hours. In that match Mace broke one of his arms and finished the fight one-banded.


