CORN NOT CAUSE OF PELLAGRA

Illinois Commission Reports After a

Long Investigation. CAUSE IS STILL A MYSTERY

Series of Elaborate Experiments and Observations Eliminate Corn from the List of Posatbilities.

SPRINGFIELD, III., Jan. 23. - Indian maise, or corn, of the variety that Illinois grows and is feeding to the world is in no manner responsible for pellagra, that mysterious disease which has been perplexing medical men of many countries for years. according to the first report of the Illinois pellagra commission, which is in readiness for presentation to the legislature.

This very important fact has been demonstrated almost beyond a doubt by the lillnots pellagra commission, which in its preliminary report will ask the legislature to appropriate \$15,000 with which to prosecute its researches during the coming two years. Its importance lies in the fact it contains the information that corn in none of its conditions is the cause of this disease.

Illinois is the first state in the union to recognize the disease officially and to make official investigation of its origin. Soon after pellagra was found to be se the Insane, where many deaths have been recorded. Governor Densen named these distinguished medical men of Illinois as a commission and empowered them to make thorough inquiry:

Dr. Frank Billings of Chicago, president;
Dr. J. L. Green, alienist of the State Board
of Administration; Dr. H. Douglas Singer,
director of the State Psychopathic institute; Dr. H. S. Grindeley, Dr. George W.
Webster, president State Board of Health;
Dr. Howard T. Ricketts, Dr. W. J. McNesl
and Dr. Oliver S. Ormsby.

The experiments have extended over a period of one year and have been largely negative, but have succeeded in eliminating practically all of the suggested causes for the disease.
