

AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER

Committee Which Drafted it Decides on Change.

PROVISIONS ARE TOO BROAD

Decide that People and Not the Council Should Decide Whether to Issue Garbage Plant Bonds.

An amendment to that section of the charter revision bill which gave the city council and mayor power to issue bonds for the construction of a garbage plant in Omaha, has been prepared and sent to Lincoln.

Representatives of the bar and business men of Omaha agree that the provisions of the proposed charter revision bill are too broad in some instances and that amendments should be offered to the bill.

W. H. DeFrance, a well known attorney with offices in the Omaha National Bank building, criticizes that provision regarding the extending the limits for street improvements.

"To my way of thinking, the present limits of 4,500 feet are ample," said Mr. DeFrance. "The proposed extension takes in practically all of the city. There are a few streets without this limit, which will need improvement.

"As to the hours for general and special elections, there is no reason why there should be any difference. If the laboring man is worthy of consideration in the matter of general elections, he should be accorded the same privileges in the special elections.

"I heartily agree with the article in The Bee Thursday, calling attention to the provisions of the proposed charter," said Charles F. Withnell, building inspector. Amendments should be made to these provisions and I have no doubt that they will win the bill comes up for further consideration.

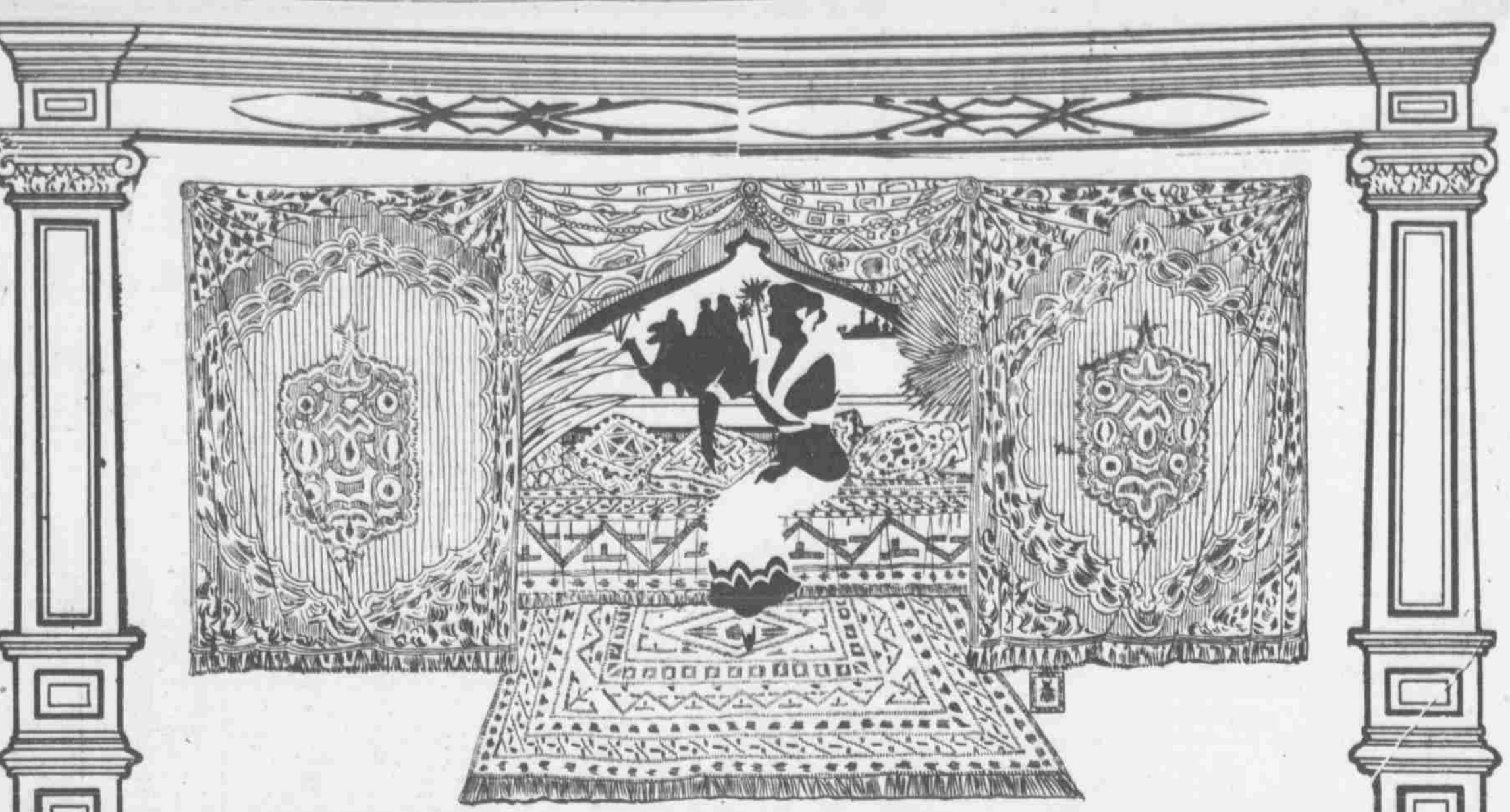
