Cosgrove Promises Not to Be Candidate for Office in 1912

State Was All Fixed Up in Caucus Before Meeting of the City Council.

Upon his promise that he would not be a candidate for the office of city comptroller in 1912 and that the republican members of the city council would be privileged to name the deputy comptroller to fill the unexpired term, Fred H. Cosgrove was appointed to the office of city comptroller, according to a member of the city council, who was present at all the caucuses which framed the slate that went through without a hitch, save for opposition from Councilman Bridges, Tuesday night.
