Pastor Charged With Trying to Influence St. Paul Grand Juror

Business Man Says Dr. Samuel Smith Approached Him in Case Panel Was Investigating.

ST. PAUL, Feb. 18.—A complaint was filed in the Ramsey district court today by Thomas L. Wann, a prominent business man and member of the Ramsey county grand jury, charging Dr. Samuel G. Smith, pastor of the People's church and member of the faculty of the University of Minnesota with an attempt to influence him as a member of the jury.

The complaint states that while the grand jury was considering an indictment against Dr. Eugene Hubbell, a physician, Dr. Smith approached Mr. Wann and by argument sought to convince him that an indictment on such a charge would be harmful.

Dr. Hubbell is well known in his profession. The grand jury found an indictment against him yesterday, charging manslaughter in causing the death of Rose Hys, January 23.

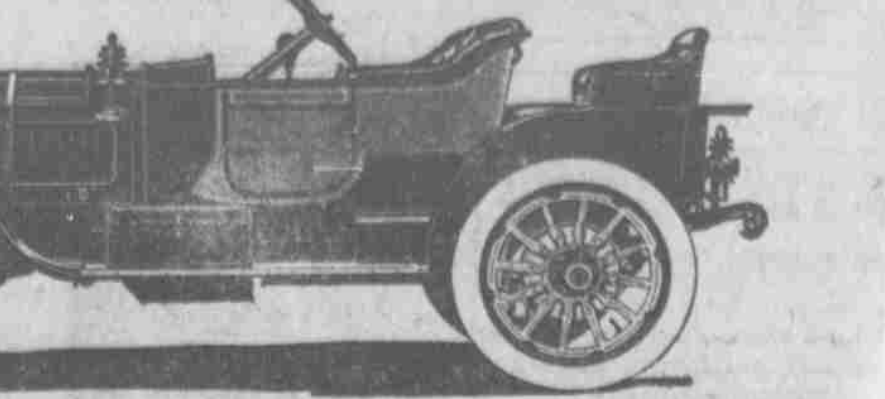

Insurrecto Leaders Retire to Mountains on Approach of Troops. CAPTAIN IS GUILTY OF TREASON. Officers of the Thirteenth Infantry Convicted of Aiding Rebels Will Be Sent to Mexico City to Be Shot.

EL PASO, Tex., Feb. 18.—Reports from Guadalupe this morning are that the insurrecto chiefs, covered by 200 armed men, have made their way into the hills south of there and that Mexican soldiers from Juarez will find the place evacuated when they reach there today.

Passenger Traffic Suspended. A train with water for section houses and stations in the desert south of here left this morning over the Mexico North-western, bound for the Mormon colonies near Juarez.

Under Kinkaid Act. On June 23, 1904, the Kinkaid act, under which settlers might enter 640 acres instead of 160 acres, as theretofore, went into effect, and it became possible with few fraudulent filings to cover an entire enclosure of about 1,280 acres.
