





BERLIN, Wednesday, Feo. 18-Herman Moltkenbuhr, member from Saxony, has been elected president of the social demo cratic faction in the Reichstag, thus re ceiving the mantle of the late Paul Singer. who, up to his death, shared the presidency of the faction with the aged leader August Babel,

Bebel has been compelled to retire almost completely from politics on account of his the occasion wore the topical songs of age and health, leaving the responsibility for the parliamentary tactics on the shoulders of Moltkenbuhr. The latter is a writer, originally a cigar marker by trady. who on account of his political activity was expelled from Germany in 1531 and spent three years in the United States. He is a hard political fighter, as pugnacious as Bebel, and aroused the Reichstag this winter with a flat declaration that his party was working for a republic in Germany. He entered the Reichstag in 1990 as a representative from Berlin and was first defeated in 1906, after which a seat was found for him in Sakony. The present trend in the party appears to be against the iron discipline and autocratic authority enjoyed by Hebel and
