Prof. G. W. Ritchey of Mount Wilson Observatory Gives Lecture.

PHOTOS THROUGH BIG TELESCOPE Explanation of Intricate Way Pic-

tures of Heavenly Bodies Are Reproduced on Films-Raller's Comer Photographed. "Isn't Venus beautiful tonight? That's rion over there." These and many other familiar refer

nces to the heavenly bodies were made by those who heard Prof. George W Ritchey, the noted astronomer, disclose the mysteries of the skies last night. The bserver at Mount Wilson talked to almost a thousand people in Creighton university auditorium, telling of his work at Pasadena with the largest telescope in he world. Many lantern slides were used as illustrations.

nearly all his life. He made his first picture of the stars at 18 and his latest achievement was the huge instrument on top of the towering California mountain. Prof Ritchey showed by comparative pictures that America is far in advance of the old world in photographing the heavens. This is due largely to the greater ingenuity of American scientists in following heavenly bodies and lessening the vibration of the telescope in use. It is often necessary to take pictures with exposures as long as twenty hours. Were not the telescope to keep the stars in perfect

Photographs Are Wonderful. The wonderful pictures taken through the greatest telescope yet made startle the observer and overwhelm the intellect with the infiniteness of the solar system. Pictures of planets were not shown, for the reason that none have ever been photographed. Clusters of stars as photographed by

looking like blurs of white. When highlower pictures of these same shown it was seen that the spots were really composed of thousands and thouands of stars. Spiral clusters photographed by the high power telescopes proved that millions of miles beyond the planets were new constellations in the making and led Prof. Ritchey to observe that many astronomers believe that "stars develop out of chaotic nebulosity." He said, too, that many astronomers believe the sun, which gives

of the milky way, which to the average mind must be a startling theory. Halley Comet Films. Many pictures of Halley's comet were also shown, from the time it was first discovered until it reached the point near-

est the earth. The lecture closed with marvelous pictures of the moon, showing in clear detail the enormous craters which cover the surface of the moon like warts. Many of these were pointed out by name and were made more realistic when their dimensions were given in some instances as being more than 100 miles in diameter and thousands Ogden, Utah. of feet in depth. Then mere pin points

were pointed out as only one mile in diameter. In closing Prof. Ritchey commented upon the spiral clusters far out in the infinite as resembling not only the beautiful formations found in shells, but also that of our own stellar system, proving as he said that all is the hand of a master creator."
