In order to eliminate the salary loan shark evil, by an order issued from head-Union Telegraph company, in cases of necessity, now loams to its worthy employes money without interest up to a month's salary. This action was taken by the Western Union company, because it was brought to its attention that many worthy employes were being imposed upon by loan sharks to an extent that in some cases smounted to hardship. One case in particuar was called to the attention of the Omaha office. More than a year ago an employe borrowed 130 of a loan shark. He paid interest on the loan at the rate of \$2 a month until he had paid \$30. The loan shark still held against him the original tote of \$30 which if paid would have com pelled the employe to pay the for a loan of \$30 to a little more than a year.

MASONS HOLDING A REUNION Eighty Becoming Members of Scottish Rite-Shriners to Initiate




