

Three of the Six Will Soon Be Under Construction.

WORK STARTS ON MASON STREET Three Are Now Being Held Up by

Action of the Courts and May Be Delayed for Some Time.

Construction work on three of the six viaducts, which the city is attempting to force railroads to build, will be under way within a short time, according to the city engineer. The viaducts contemplated are the Nicholas street. Mason street, Locust street, Bancroft street and Dodge street structures.

Work has already begun on the Mason street affair, which will span the street at Ninteenth street, Great Western railroad officials have broken ground and closed the street to traffic.

That is as far as practical work has been done in any of the viaducts, though ordinances directing the building have been passed, save for the Eleventh street and Nicholas street bridges.

The railroads concerned in the Eleventh street and Nicholas street structures have agreed to build under the plane, as drawn by the city engineer. Mr. Craig says it will be but a short time until these roads get busy. An ordinance directing the building of the Eleventh street viaduct was introduced into the council Tuesday night and passed first and second readings. Its ultimate passage is but a question of a week. The Union Pacific and the Burlington railroads, which are concerned in the building, have agreed to the plans as approved by the council. This structure will extend from Jackson street to Mason street. The Nicholas street structure is also assured, unless the Omaha road, the North-


